

Tudor CONSTANTINESCU

Principal Adviser to the Director-General for Energy in the European Commission

Tudor Constantinescu is Principal Adviser to the Director General for Energy in the European Commission. Economist and engineer, he is dedicated to the topic of sustainable and competitive energy policies. He coordinates notably activities related to steering the use of Structural Funds for energy priorities and initiatives related to Hydrogen and energy storage. Tudor Constantinescu is an active member of the European policy community since twenty years and brought his expert knowledge and ideas to high government organizations and industry in the energy sector.



Before starting with the European Commission in 2011, he set up as founding Executive Director the Buildings Performance Institute Europe (BPI Europe), the European pole of a global best practice network focusing on energy efficiency in buildings. He was the president of the Romanian Agency for Energy Conservation (ARCE), the national Governmental institution in charge of energy efficiency policies and programs, and promoting renewable energy sources. He also ensured the rotating presidency of the EnR network of European Energy Agencies. In the private sector, he led as a consultant the development of the Energy Efficiency strategy for Petrom and served for two years on the Board of the Romanian Energy Efficiency Fund.

For 11 years, he worked for the Energy Charter Secretariat in Brussels coordinating energy efficiency and related environmental activities. Tudor Constantinescu holds a master degree and a Doctor of Science degree in energy from the University Politehnica Bucharest, and a master degree in applied economics from the Institute of Advanced Studies Vienna.
